



In early 2020, a group of Liberians living in the United States, originally from Kakata, Margibi County, came together with a shared vision: to uplift and support their hometown in meaningful and lasting ways.

The inspiration to form an organized body emerged during two funerals of fallen Kakata community members, where the need for structured support and community solidarity became clear. What began as a response to grief quickly transformed into a purposeful mission to address broader challenges in education, infrastructure, healthcare, and social welfare.

This shared commitment led to the establishment of the TeamKakata Association (TKA)—a nonprofit charitable organization officially granted 501(c)(3) status in the United States. Since its founding, TKA has remained actively engaged in supporting the people of Kakata. Its initiatives have included donating critical medical supplies to C.H. Rennie Hospital, which was severely damaged by fire; distributing educational materials to some schools in the city; and organizing annual food and clothing distributions for vulnerable families and individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Most recently, TKA has begun construction on a state-of-the-art Learning Resource Center to further advance educational opportunities for students in Kakata.

Kakata, with a population exceeding 33,945 residents, boasts the second-largest student population in Liberia. The city is home to approximately 5,000 high school students and hosts more than ten high schools, including the renowned Booker T. Washington Institute (BWI). Established in 1929, BWI is Liberia's oldest vocational institution, named in honor of Booker T. Washington, a prominent African American educator and intellectual of the 19th century.

TKA's efforts reflect its strong commitment to improving the lives of Kakata's residents through focused initiatives in education, healthcare, and community welfare. By leveraging its nonprofit status and the dedication of its members, TKA continues to play a vital role in promoting development and enhancing the well-being of both the Kakata community and Margibi County at large.
